While presenting a positive image to spectators, the following is designated to support good animal husbandry both at home and at this show.

ALL DAIRY CATTLE EXHIBITORS

The following practices or procedures are considered unacceptable and defined as being unethical in the show ring of registered dairy cattle.

1. Misrepresenting the age of the animal for the Class in which it is shown.
2. Balancing the udder by any means other than by leaving naturally produced milk in any or all quarters.
3. Treating the udder, internally or externally with an irritant, counter-irritant, or other substance to **temporarily improve conformation** or produce unnatural animation.
4. Minimizing the effects of crampiness by feeding or injecting drugs.
5. Surgery of any kind performed to change the natural contour of appearance of the animal's body, hide or hair. Not included is the removal of warts, teats and horns, clipping and dressing of hair and trimming of hooves.
6. Insertion of foreign material/articles under the skin, into the topline or on the feet. Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring or other conduct detrimental to the breed or show.

Note: All Exhibitors will be required to sign the Mandatory Exhibitor's Agreement before being allowed to enter the ring to exhibit cattle entries. The show committee will also be the ethics committee for the Jersey show.

PREMIER BREEDER AWARD

An attractive "Premier Breeder Banner", donated by Agri-Brands Purina will be awarded to the individual, partnership or institution winning the greatest number of points, calculations to be made on the following basis:

- (A) Females, 2 years and over: 20 points will be awarded for each first prize and two points will be deducted for each placing below first, provided that in no case will points be awarded for placing below tenth.
- (B) Females less than 2 years of age: 10 points will be awarded for each first prize and one point will be deducted for each placing below first.
- (C) Points will be calculated on an exhibit of seven animals.
- (D) All animals included in the calculations must have been bred but not necessarily owned by winner.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR AWARD

An attractive "Premier Exhibitor Banner", donated by Agri-Brands Purina will be awarded to the exhibitor winning the greatest number of points, calculations to be made in accordance with the schedule applicable to the Premier Breeder Award.

- (A) Points will be calculated on an exhibit of seven animals (same as Premier Breeder).
- (B) Animals comprising the exhibit must be owned but not necessarily bred by the exhibitor.

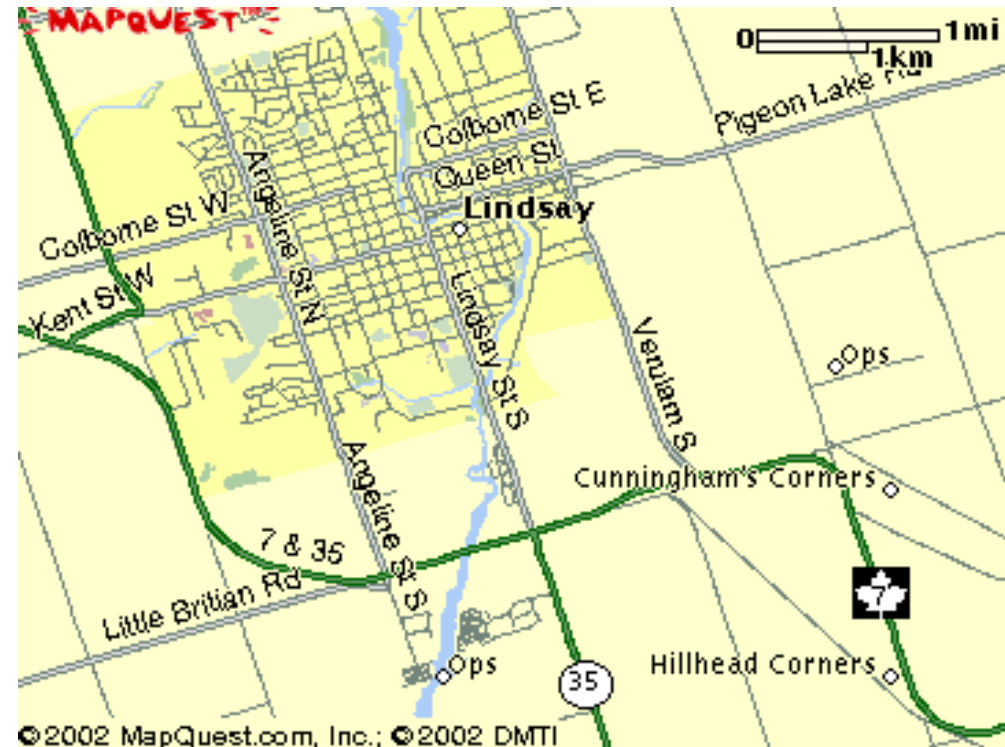
RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. **The show is recognized as a purebred show and, as such, registrations will be governed by Livestock Rules and Regulations. Registrations must be paid in full. Entries must be in exhibitor's name, otherwise papers and transfer fees must be collected by the show committee to send to Jersey Canada, Guelph.**
2. There shall be no limit on the number of entries made by an exhibitor.
3. No animal may be shown in more than one Class for single animals except for a championship, a special prize or in the Best Udder Class. To be eligible for a group Class every member of the group must be exhibited in the appropriate Class for single animals.
4. At the time of making entry the following information must be given with respect to each animal entered:
 - Name and Registration number, Date of Birth, Tattoo/EZE IR Tag #
 - Name and Registration of the Sire
 - Entered in the name of the registered owner(s).
5. Substitutions will be allowed as follows:
 - 2 substitutions per exhibitor
 - Substitutions must be made upon arrival.
6. The registration certificates of all entries **must accompany cattle to the show** and be available for checking by an official of the breed association.
7. An animal owned by more than one individual, firm or corporation, must be registered in the names of such owners jointly, and when shown as a single animal must be entered in the names of the joint owners. In the event that one of the joint owners is the breeder of the animal he may include it in a group Class having a "Bred-And-Owned" requirement. **A joint ownership entry must be made on a separate Entry Form.**
8. An exhibitor is not required to list the names and numbers of animals comprising a breeder's herd at the time of making entry. Papers could be checked upon request.
9. All exhibitors are required to dress in white shirts and trousers to match while showing in the ring. Such attire shall not bear any letters, marks or labels purporting to reveal the identity of the exhibitors.
10. All animals must be identified by Harness Numbers in the show ring. We will provide containers for recycling the cards.
11. Jersey Ontario insists mandatory use of NLID tags at all championship shows, including Ontario Summer Show. If not tagged by check in, the animal can not be shown.
12. All exhibitors are required to sign the exhibitors agreement concerning show ethics, which was sent out with the entry forms, before any animals entered by the exhibitor can be shown

MANURE

- We ask for all exhibitors' cooperation in keeping the barn as clean as possible. If your animal drops manure in the aisles we ask that you clean it up immediately. Manure must be removed by the exhibitor and taken to the specified containers outside the barn for the duration of the show.
- We ask that absolutely no glass, string, pop cans, etc. be put in manure spreaders. Garbage pails will be available for other than manure garbage.

- On the bottom of the entry form nominate a judge for the 2011 Summer show. The nominations will be reviewed by the show committee and a selection will be made.
